Installation

Installing Dawn of Discovery™

Start up Windows.

Close all running applications, including those running in the background (e.g., virus scanner software).

To install Dawn of Discovery, insert the DVD into your computer and follow the instructions. If the Installer is not launched automatically, explore the contents of the DVD and double-click on the file named "autorun.exe".

Uninstalling Dawn of Discovery

For Windows XP:

Click on the Start menu and navigate to the Dawn of Discovery program folder, then select Uninstall.

For Windows Vista:

PLAYING THE GAME

Quick Entry

For all those who want to play instantly, this page should serve as a quick overview of the in-game menus. You will get additional help throughout the entire game, from Lord Richard Northburgh. Just hover your cursor over elements on the screen, and you will get additional information via tooltips.

The Info bar shows you the number of gold coins you have, and how much honor you have, as well as the building materials of the visible island in the center of your screen.

The Fertility bar tells you which plants will grow on this island, and which raw materials can be collected.

All your opponents will interact with you via the Third-Party window. Here you will also get information on selected objects, e.g., houses and ships.

The News system tells you about recent events and assignments.

The Mini Map gives you an overview of the World Map, and shows you the number of people living on all of your islands, as well as your recent balance. You may also cycle through your ships and warehouses using the small buttons.



The Main Menu holds all other menus: the Construction menu, the Diplomacy screen, the Route planning, all available Achievements, the Quest log, an overview of your cities, armadas, and armies, the Action archive, the Pipette and Demolish mode, as well as the Options menu.

MENUS

Dawn of Discovery offers a large variety of settings for your convenience, to make the game experience as pleasant as possible. Before you start the game, you may create an individual profile and adjust the video, menu, and sound options to match your personal taste.

Note: At the end of the installation, Dawn of Discovery checks your PC for performance and automatically adjusts the settings to match the existing hardware, to assure a smooth gaming experience. These settings can be modified at any time in the Options menu.

Creating and Modifying Profiles

The Profile menu can be opened by clicking on the lowest button on the Start menu. The default profile is called "ANNOnymous". Here you may create new profiles or modify existing ones. You can see what Medals and Successes you have achieved so far, as well as activated and unactivated Bonus content. Some parts of the settings offer additional information via tooltips, if you hover your cursor over one of the unachieved Successes. Please note that titles and coats of arms are only available once they have been activated.

Start Menu

From here you have direct access to the world of Dawn of Discovery. For those who cannot wait, Quick entry offers a way into the game without further delay. If you select Continuous Play, you can choose from three different difficulty level presets, which you can adjust to match your personal preference before starting the game.

Gateway to the World

Dawn of Discovery offers you the possibility to upload your profile data, as well as achieved Medals and Successes, screenshots, and saved games to a specially set up Web page. You can show them to the Dawn of Discovery community and have them use your own saved game.

Options

Experienced users can modify the video, interface, and sound settings at any time. You may also modify the keyboard layout (hot keys).

If you hover your cursor over the buttons, you will get additional information via tooltips.

GAME MODES

Dawn of Discovery offers various single-player modes like Quick Start, Continuous Play, Campaign, and Scenarios.

Quick Start

Quick Start brings you right into the world of Dawn of Discovery. Initially, this option will bring you to the first mission of the campaign, with the difficulty level set to Easy. If there is an existing saved game for the selected profile, the saved game will be loaded.

Continuous Play

You can choose to start Continuous Play in either Easy, Medium, or Hard mode, or to modify the settings beforehand. You may also start a new game, using the previous settings.

If you wish to modify the default settings, select Adjust Settings and browse through five pages of settings options to create your individual game. Navigate left and right using the arrows at the side of the menu. Hover your cursor over the buttons to get additional information via tooltips.

Campaign

The Emperor is very ill. Help Lord Richard Northburgh to erect a giant Emperor's dome, to plead for God's mercy and for the Emperor's convalescence...

A thrilling adventure awaits you, packed with mystic characters and mysterious cultures. Each campaign mission can be played at any difficulty level.

Scenarios

You can choose from six different scenarios to master, two for each difficulty level. Besides the winning conditions displayed, several other assignments will await you. Be surprised.

HANDLING

After you have chosen a game mode, adjusted the setting, and started a game, you will see the in-game screen.

Handling Conventions

You can play the game using only a mouse, but there are also keyboard shortcuts available for most commands. Usually you open menus, select and construct buildings, and select ships by clicking the left mouse button. You can select more than one ship by clicking and drawing a frame around the desired group of ships. With a click on the game screen outside of menus, you can close them. You can also close a menu by hitting the Esc key. If no menu is open, hitting the Esc key opens the Option menu.

Game Screen

The game screen shows you everything that is happening in the world of Dawn of Discovery. You can zoom in and out using the scroll wheel on your mouse, or you can do this using F2/F4 or Page up/Page down. Use the Z and X keys to rotate the view clockwise and counterclockwise. You can also rotate the view by pressing and holding the mouse wheel and moving the mouse left or right.

You can move the view left or right or up and down several ways: using the cursor keys, or moving the mouse cursor to the sides of the screen, or to the top or bottom. The view will then scroll smoothly in the desired direction.

If you press and hold the right mouse button, the view will instantly scroll in the direction you move the mouse to.

Main Menu

The Main Menu is located in the lower right corner of the game screen. It holds the following sub-menus:

Construction Menu

The Construction menu holds all important types of buildings you need to build a flourishing settlement. Different buildings will be available during different Civilization levels. Later on in the game it also depends on your relationship to the Orient. For most of the buildings a certain number of citizens is required.

Demolition Mode

You can demolish buildings either by hitting the Delete key or by activating the Demolition mode. When activated, the cursor transforms into a pickaxe. If you click on a building with the pickaxe, it will immediately be demolished. Depending on the game's settings, you will get the building costs, tools, and building materials back, which were used to construct the building.

Diplomacy Menu



Here you can set up diplomatic relationships with your opponents and foreign cultures. Once you have found an opponent or foreign culture, they will automatically appear in the Diplomacy menu.

Route Planning



Here you will find an overview of the game world, where you can create trade routes for all your ships.

Achievements

Once your people have reached the Citizens level, this menu will be activated. You will see all completed achievements, as well as any still left to complete.

Game Options and Advanced Game Menu

Ouest Log

This shows you all open assignments, or you can toggle to see those already accomplished.

Cities, Armadas, and Armies

This menu gives you an overview of all your warehouses and ships, as well as all armies you command. You may sort the list in different ways. Hover your cursor over the arrows to get detailed information on the respective list options.

Actions Archive

The Actions Archive gives you access to the following actions:

Screen Shot: Creates a screen shot that will be saved in the folder [USER]/Documents/ DawnOfDiscovery/ (Windows Vista) or [USER]/My Documents/DawnOfDiscovery (Windows XP). You can upload screen shots to your personal Dawn of Discovery profile Web page via the Gate to the World menu

Quicksave: Saves a game quickly.

Quickload: Load your last quickly saved game.

Pause: Pause the game and relax!

Postcard View: Activate this view and fly across the Dawn of Discovery landscape using the cursor keys. Use the mouse to rotate the camera. Go back to the game by hitting the Esc key.

Slow Down Game: Slow down the game's speed, so you do not miss a thing.

Speed Up Game: Bored of waiting for your ship to arrive at its destination or of waiting for new building material? Speed up the game!

Cycle Through Ships: Find any ship easily using this button. Each click will jump to the next ship of your armada.

Cycle Through Warehouses: Works exactly like with ships, only with all the warehouses on all islands you own.

Pipette Mode: Copy any building you have already constructed by activating this mode and left-clicking on the building you want to build again. This saves you from browsing through the Construction menu.

Options Menu: Adjust the screen resolution, sound, and music volume, as well as the keyboard layout. You can also save games, and load saved games. You can restart the running map, go back to the Start menu, or guit Dawn of Discovery.

Object Menu

The Preview window shows basic information of a selected object: for ships it will display the attack power, cargo capacity, running costs, and any orders you can give the ship. For buildings it will display basic information, like running costs and inhabitants, as well as special commands like the upgrade button for market buildings and warehouses.

Mini-Map



The Mini-Map at the bottom left corner of the screen shows a minimized view of the World Map. The map can be hidden at the start of a game and be slowly revealed while traveling with a ship from island to island. The numbers at the top of the Mini-Map indicate the overall amount of inhabitants of all of your cities, as well as your actual balance. If you hover your cursor over the hourglass you will see the actual time, how long you have been playing Dawn of Discovery in total, and how long you have been playing this particular map.

Two small buttons will allow you to cycle through your warehouses and ships.

News System



On the left side of the screen, small icons indicate important events that require your attention. If you hover your cursor over one of these icons you will get a short summary in a tooltip. Left-clicking opens the respective menu or centers the view on the place of





The info bar on the upper left corner of the screen shows you the contents of your treasure chamber, and the honors collected so far. If the view centers over an island, you will see the amount of building materials and tools stored there. You will also see which plants will grow well here, and if you can plant additional seeds here.

Left-clicking on the fertility bar opens an additional window that shows you the mineable deposits on the island (e.g., Stone, Brine, or Iron), or if there are hunting grounds.

There are many more exciting ways to explore in Dawn of Discovery. Your journey is only beginning!
