The events and happenings at an all-night party impact your Sims' reputations and lifestyles—for better or worse!

GETTING STARTED

Get your Sims an all-access pass to the hottest spots in town where they can mingle with celebrities or enjoy a casual night out with friends. Your Sims' social lives are getting a boost! Keep in mind that some scenes are more exclusive than others, so make sure your Sims have the right connections to get past the bouncers at the most exclusive clubs. Wherever your Sims go, there are new Sims to meet including adored celebrities, all-night partiers, rowdy band mates, and sexy vampires!

What will your Sims do after dark?

STARTING A NEW GAME



If you already have saved data for *The Sims 3*, choose to continue your existing game from the main menu after installing *The Sims 3 Late Night*. You can also start a new game in the lively city of Bridgeport or any of your other favorite neighborhoods.

To start a new game, begin by choosing a neighborhood from the pull-down menu. Then select the checkmark icon to load your selection.

After completing the tutorial (or skipping it if you're already an expert), select CHOOSE A HOUSEHOLD to play with pre-made Sims who already live in your selected town.

For pre-made households, click one of the blue house icons to read a description of the household members and the house, see the difficulty level, view the size of the lot, and check on how many Simoleons they have. Left-click SELECT on the description pop-up to play using that household.

NOTE: Move your Sunset Valley Sims to Bridgeport by selecting EDIT TOWN while in Sunset Valley, and then select SAVE COPY TO LIBRARY to move a copy of your Sims to the library. Then start a new game in Bridgeport and select MOVE IN HOUSEHOLD to move your Sims into an available lot. You cannot edit items in the library, but you may delete or share them at any time. Sims saved into the library lose all relationships with members of their town of origin.

NOTE: Once you've completed the tutorial, choose an empty lot and build a custom home for your Sims.

SAVING AND LOADING

Every saved game represents an entire town. To save, select SAVE from the options menu. Enter a name for your game and then select the checkmark icon. You can always return to your game or start a new one at the main menu.

To load a saved game, go to the main menu and select the saved game that you want to play.

LATE NIGHTS

DIVE BARS



The working Sims' favorite places to take a breather with other locals from the neighborhood, Dive Bars offers an unpretentious environment where juice is cheap and the memories made are priceless. Take the stage as part of a band and become the next breakout music sensation!

HIGH END LOUNGES



Sims not only have to sip their juice with class, but they also have to dress to impress the celebrity clientele who enjoy surrounding themselves with sophisticated juice concoctions and opulent decor. Buy a round of juice in High End Lounges to purchase popularity from the posh, or woo your way into the ranks of celebrities with your silver tongue and debonair style.



DANCE CLUBS



Home to fancy juice drinks, endless music, and packed dance floors, what's not to love about Dance Clubs? Every Sim loves to boogie, whether it's to chill out or simply an excuse to get down with a new love interest, celebrity, or even a vampire or two.

ADDING VENUES

Creating a new venue in your neighborhood is easy! Start by selecting EDIT TOWN in the options menu and choose an empty lot or a pre-existing one. Select CHANGE LOT TYPE and be sure it is marked as a Community lot. Then designate an identifier from the drop-down menu such as Dance Club, Dive Bar, Fusion Lounge, and more. Sims can gossip with other Sims or read the newspaper to learn which venue is the nightly trend-setting hotspot!

SIM STARDOM SEEK CELEBRITY STATUS



Now every Sim has the ability to become a celebrity—or at least socialize with some! Networking is key, and knowing the right Sims can help your Sims reach star status and gain a paparazzi following.

To become celebrities, your Sims must increase their Celebrity Level by gaining Celebrity Points. Start schmoozing to strengthen the relationship with celebrity friends! Once your Sims have become celebrities, see details on their celebrity status by opening the Celebrity Journal found on the Simology tab (or press L). View the Celebrity Level of your Sims on their name tooltip by hovering over a specific Sim with your mouse.

A STAR IS BORN

When your Sims enter the world of celebrity stardom, they unlock new benefits available only to Sims of their stature. Other Sims around town start to notice your Sims more and react differently. Some may even ask for an autograph or picture!

Celebrities occasionally receive free gifts from local business and discounts from venue purchases. If a business owner really likes a celebrity, then they won't charge them anything at all!

However, life as a celebrity is not always free stuff and adoring fans. Once your Sims start to become famous, the public harshly judges any inappropriate actions. Make a wrong move and your Sims may end up being the fodder of salacious gossip of the week. During this time of public disgrace, your Sims have a harder time getting into exclusive clubs and lose celebrity perks such as discounts and freebies. In order to win back the admiration of the public, your Sims must pay off the paparazzi, clear their name in court, deflect the disgrace to another celebrity. or talk to other Sims to set the rumors to rest.

CASTING ALL SIMS

Pursue a career in the film business as an actor or a director and schmooze with coworkers on set. Do your Sims have what it takes to earn a star of fame as a Distinguished Director or a Superstar Actor?

BE IN A BAND

Think your Sims have the talent and poise to become the next music sensation? Then why not join a band! Starting out can be tough to make ends meet, but keep at it and your Sims' bands will rake in the Simoleons and receive performance requests from all around the neighborhood!

HOW TO FORM A BAND

Once your Sims have learned at least one skill level on any musical instrument, they are ready to start a band! Forming a band is as simple as talking to other musically-inclined Sims. Ask them to form a band with your Sims and, if they agree, then it's time to start accepting gigs! Your Sims' bands can have up to four members

TIP: Not everyone rocks, and when it's one of your bandmates that doesn't rock, it's time to let them go. To cut a band member, select that Sim and use the Kick Out interaction.

GETTING GIGS

Gig offers start coming in soon after your Sims form bands. When gig offers come calling, make sure to answer your Sims' phone or miss out on a show!

When your Sims' band lands a gig, head to the location at the correct time. Your Sims' band meets at the location, so don't worry about picking up any bandmates along the way. As soon as everyone has arrived, select PERFORM A GIG on an instrument to start rocking out! If your Sims ever feel like mixing it up, switch the music genre or, if your Sims are confident in their skills, use the Sweet Move interaction to impress the crowd

KEEPING TABS ON THE BAND

The Band tab in the Skill Journal allows you to stay up-to-date with your Sims' musical ensembles. Review how many gigs they've played, how many Simoleons they've earned, and any name changes the band goes through. Press $\bf J$ to open your Sims's Skill Journal.

FULL-TIME GIG

Register as self-employed to have your Sims focus on their band full-time! After forming a band, use the phone or send your Sims to City Hall to register as SELF-EMPLOYED (under JOBS AND PROFESSIONS). When you check your Sims' career panel, it shows their involvement with the band! Perform at gigs and play for tips to progress up the band career ladder!

NEW SKILLS



The Sims 3 Late Night offers a handful of new skills for your Sims to aspire to and excel at.

MIXOLOGY

Anyone can mix a juice drink, but to mix a juice drink with pizzazz and punch takes the skill of an experienced Mixologist. Sims are now able to learn a vast variety of cool concoctions to quench the thirst of the masses and, with time, add a dash of flair to make a spectacle of it as well.

MOONLIGHTING

For Sims living paycheck-to-paycheck, or just looking for a little extra cash, they can now moonlight as Mixologists to help pocket extra Simoleons. If your Sims have at least two skill points in Mixology, then they can moonlight at a bar. To start moonlighting, head to a bar venue and select MOONLIGHT AS MIXOLOGIST on the bar object. Lower-end venues, like Dive Bars, accept Sims with less Mixology skill than higher-end venues. Your Sims may also get offers from around town when venues need extra help for special events.

BECOMING A NIGHTWALKER



Unfortunately, your Sims simply won't be able to buy their way into this ultra exclusive club. Expect to rely on a charming personality and exquisite taste to coax a vampire into welcoming your Sims to their inner-circle of night dwellers. However, you won't find these charming night owls hanging around just anywhere. Your Sims have to stalk and scour the trendiest hotspots and swankiest surroundings in order to catch a glimpse of these elusive creatures.

AFTER YOU'VE JOINED THE DARK SIDE

There is a wealth of advantages to be had by becoming a creature of the night. Vampire Sims gain skills more quickly at night than normal Sims. Also, vampire Sims have a wealth of special abilities to help them snag their next meal, such as sniffing out the most scrumptious Sims to drink from and running faster than normal Sims.

While vampires are exceptional at nearly everything they do, beware of the damaging effects of daylight and qarlic. Exposure causes negative Moodlets and disables their special abilities.



LIVIN' THE LIFE



The Sims 3 Late Night offers some new tools to help modernize and stylize your abode.

HIGH-RISES AND YOUR SIM

High-Rises make it easy for your Sims to pick a dream home that matches their personality. High-Rise buildings come in a variety of styles, such as Art Deco or Wild and Whacky, so no matter what you are looking for, there is a building to fit your Sims' tastes and lifestyle.

Sims who live in High-Rise buildings are restricted to building within the walls of their individual unit. Public spaces cannot be altered.

HALF-WALLS

Large open rooms are stylish, airy, and modern, but sometimes you need to break up the space just a bit. Not enough to close off a room, but enough to organize the area. The Half-wall tool is here to help. Separate the kitchen from the living room, give some privacy in the bedroom, or even set up bathroom stalls to accommodate party guests. Half-walls are found in the Build Mode catalog.

PLATFORMS

Add a little spice to a room with this tool! Even if you don't have a lot of furniture to occupy an area, a platform helps draw attention to whatever may be resting on its surface. Arrange instruments on a platform to create stages where bands can perform. The Platform tool is found in Build Mode in the same section as DECKS AND FOUNDATIONS.

CURVED AND INDOOR POOLS

What else says you've made it to the big leagues than your Sims' very own indoor pool! For something ultra-cool, try a rooftop pool! Successful Sims yearn to have a pool installed somewhere in or on their home. To get started, go to Build Mode and use the Create Pool tool to add a pool almost anywhere! Add some curves to an outdoor or indoor pool by selecting the Create Pool tool in Build Mode. Next, select CREATE CURVED POOL and use the sliders to determine the size of your curved pool piece. Press and > to rotate Curved Pool pieces. Remember to leave part of your pool wall straight so there is space to place a pool ladder!

FOUNTAINS

Fountains add panache and opulence to your Sims' homes. Place them inside as a beautiful centerpiece or outside to show off your Sims' wealth to the neighbors.

Use the Create a Fountain tool in Build Mode to start building a fountain. Embellish the shape of your fountain using Curved Fountain pieces which can be rotated with by pressing < and >. Use Fountain Objects to beautify your creation with sprays and jets of water to bring your fountain to life! Fountain Objects also come in handy with your Sims' ponds and pools.

ADJUSTING HEIGHT OF WALL DECOR

There's an art to hanging art. Before it was all about just finding the perfect section of the room, but now you also have to figure out how high or low to fasten your décor to the plaster. To adjust the height, grab the art with your mouse and move up and down the wall until you find just the right spot.
